

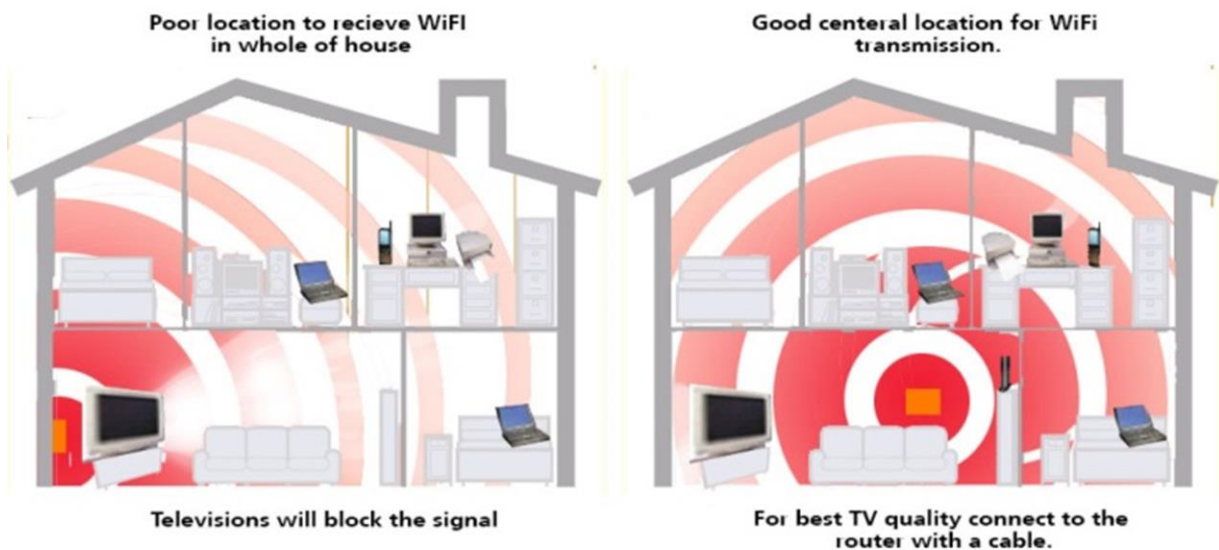
## Extending my Wifi

Generally B4RN don't tend to recommend the general Wi-Fi repeaters or boosters, they tend to cause as many problems as they solve. A mesh is almost always better than a booster in every way except for the price. If we were to recommend a booster then I'd say one of the powerline ones would be best (an example <https://www.amazon.co.uk/TL-WPA4220KIT-Powerline-Broadband-Configuration-UK/dp/B01LXOZ4EN/>) But even then, for just £20 more you can get a cheap mesh that would probably work better.

As for the Mesh systems B4RN tend to recommend BT Whole Homes, out of all of the ones that they have tested they find the BT to be the best at handling a large amount of devices and getting through walls. <https://shop.bt.com/learnmore/bt-branded-products-and-services/bt-whole-home-wi-fi/>

The Tenda Novas are a decent cheaper option for those who don't want to break the bank, they usually work quite well but B4RN have run into some issues in the past (These are the cheapest ones which would manage in some cases <https://www.amazon.co.uk/Tenda-Nova-Coverage-Ethernet-Configured/dp/B07CTH2RPZ/>).

And then direct Ethernet cabling is always the best way to get a consistent and reliable connection, most people are reluctant to run long cables all around their houses though.
